Iran's Bad Faith Behavior

Despite agreeing to a nuclear deal with the P5+1 on July 14, Iran has escalated its anti-Western rhetoric and pledged to increase support for its terrorist proxies. As Congress considers the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), it should take into account Iran's intentions to use the billions freed up by the JCPOA to support its malign activities in the Middle East. Kuwaiti authorities discovered a huge arms cache seized in Kuwait last week was smuggled into the country from Iran. This story echoes last week's events in [Bahrain](#), where authorities broke up an Iranian arms smuggling ring. Iran is prohibited from exporting conventional arms for five years under the terms of UNSC Resolution 2231.

We'll allow neither economic, nor political, nor cultural intrusion of US," Khamenei tweeted. "Americans also try to penetrate into region. They want to disintegrate #Iraq & #Syria. We do not allow this and it won't happen by God help."
