Palestinian driver in East Jerusalem kills baby, wounds 8 in train station attack

A Palestinian resident of East Jerusalem drove his car into a crowded light-rail station Wednesday, killing a 3-month-old baby and wounding eight people, two of them seriously, according to Israeli police. The driver was identified as Abd al-Rahman al-Shaludi, a resident of the Silwan neighborhood who, according to police spokesman Micky Rosenfeld, has been previously jailed in Israel for involvement in terrorist activities. "Police arrived on the scene, and the driver was shot as he attempted to flee the vehicle," Rosenfeld said. Police said that Shaludi was critically injured and that his exact motives were unclear. "I do not see an end to this unrest," said Shaul Bartal, a retired Israeli major. "This is a popular protest, and it is growing. The police have arrested more than 800 people, charged more than half of them, but it does not help. There are still more people ready to demonstrate."
