'We are all Jews,' Obama declares as world marks Holocaust Remembrance Day

President Barack Obama on Wednesday warned of the growing threat of anti-Semitism, declaring that “any attack on any faith is an attack on all our faiths.” Speaking at the Israeli embassy in Washington, D.C. to honor non-Jews who saved Jewish lives during the Holocaust, the president declared: “We are all indeed Jews...Anti-Semitism is on the rise, we cannot deny it.” “When we see Jews leaving Europe... and attacks on Jewish centers from Mumbai to Kansas; when we see swastikas appear on college campuses, we must not stay silent,” Obama said. Israeli Ambassador to the United States Ron Dermer warmly welcomed the president during his opening remarks. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu sent a videotaped message that was played during the festivities, reports The Jerusalem Post. “I thank you for your commitment to continue to work with us to bolster Israel's security,” Prime Minister Netanyahu said, addressing President Obama.
