## SAVE THE DATE AIPAC's Annual Policy Conference: March 11-13, 2007

The American Israel Public Affairs Committee will hold its annual Policy Conference in less than 5 weeks, March 11-13, at the Washington D.C. Convention Center.

AIPAC delegates representing all 50 states will travel to the nation's capital to lobby their Members of Congress and show their support for the U.S.- Israel relationship. Set to be AIPAC's largest Policy conference ever, the event will bring together more than 5,000 pro-Israel activists, including 1000 students representing over 250 campuses.

Previous AIPAC Policy Conference speakers have included: President George Bush, President Bill Clinton, Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, Senate Republican Leader Mitch McConnell, Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi, House Republican Leader John Boehner, House Majority Leader Steny Hoyer, and House Republican Whip Roy Blunt.
